Bill Chapman has been very active in the climate debate since 2016, the first time he gave a SkeptiCamp presentation on the subject. He has travelled to DC over half a dozen times to attend conferences and lobby congress on climate. Bill has been specializing in outreach to conservatives, which is, to say the least, an uphill battle. The debate has evolved over the years, and Bill would like to comment on the current state of affairs.

Lents **The Sexual Evolution: The Deep Roots of Sex, Gender, and Sexuality** We are currently living through a social upheaval in the area of sex and gender, making the sexual revolution of the 1960s look pale in comparison. 4:30 PM 5:00 PM Rob Palmer The UFO Presentation THEY Don't Want You to Attend

Most of the public believes that aliens are visiting Earth in their UFOs, and many believe their government is suppressing this (for reasons). Although most scientists & skeptics dispute this, due to the prodigious number of exoplanets now known to exist, most of them routinely state with confidence that extraterrestrial civilizations are very likely and perhaps even abundant in the Milky Way, and "first contact" is only a matter of time. This presentation will explore whether this ubiquitous optimism is warranted.

5:00 PM 5:30 PM Mitchell Lampert Ancient Secrets of the Great Pyramids Revealed! (Spoiler Alert: It Was NOT Aliens.)
We might not know everything about how the ancient pyramids of Egypt were built, historically speaking. But, archeologists actually know quite a bit more than most people realize, about its possible methods of construction! Enough knowledge that we mere humans probably could rebuild them today, if we had to, using ONLY the tools available 4,000 years ago!

Of course, we would have to settle on one of several competing ideas for its assembly process, first. (I would root for the Internal Ramp Theory, but I suspect I might be outvoted on that one.) Then we would have to convince 20,000+ people, at a time, to commit to the excessively dangerous labor of doing so, over the course of several decades. But, other than that: it should be a piece of cake!

This talk will offer a brief overview of some of that knowledge; and why it is pointless to assert aliens into the picture, anymore.

Olga Ast

I'm an interdisciplinary artist, curator and independent scholar. One of my main goals is to investigate connections between time, space and information. I have exhibited and lectured in the U.S. and abroad, presenting my work at art-science projects, including art shows and multidisciplinary conferences at Rutgers, New York, Gottingen, Moscow, Toronto and other universities; the Massachusetts Institute of Technology; the National Academy of Sciences; the Museum of Natural Sciences of Turin; the Bridges Math Art exhibit and the International Conferences on Time Perspectives. My books include Fleeing from Absence: four cross-disciplinary essays on time, its nature and its interpretations; and Infinite Instances: Studies & Images of Time, a collection of papers and artworks by contributors to the ArcheTime project, which I have been curating since 2009.

Bill Chapman

Bill got a BS in Engineering with emphasis on Computer Science from Caltech in 1983, after which he spent about 20 years writing CAD software for chip design. Outside his major, his education, between high school and college, includes 4 years of physics, 3 of chemistry, and several years of calculus. Most of Bill's education in economics came from working for Wall Street as a computer programmer since 2005, where his firm would hire former traders to teach the programmers finance and economics. Bill ran an economics discussion group from 2013-2016 before running out of things to talk about, and switched his focus to climate change in 2016. In addition to outreach to conservatives, Bill also focuses on trying to promote greater technical sophistication among climate activists.
